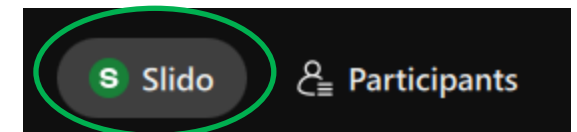
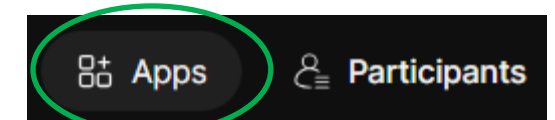

Weatherized Tier

Background and Program Documents

- > The Non-LMI EE/BE Order (May 2025) required NYS Clean Heat to begin offering a separate incentive for projects that meet a minimum weatherization level, a Weatherized Tier (“Wx Tier”)
- > Clean Heat will implement the Weatherized Tier starting on September 1, 2026
- > The June 16 Program Announcement included a summary of the Weatherized Tier
- > Updated official Program documents:
 - July 15, 2026: Implementation Plan
 - September 1, 2026: Program Manual
 - Official filings are on the NYS Department of Public Service Document Matter Master (DMM) [site](#) under case 25-M-0248
- > New Contractor Resources Page at NYSCleanHeat.com will host all Program documents

Weatherized Tier Eligibility Setting

- > There will be three ways for customers to qualify for the Weatherized Tier:
 - Post-2010 Build/Modern Home Pathway
 - Past Participation Pathway
 - Performance Pathway

- > A home only needs to qualify through **one** of the three pathways to be eligible for the Weatherized Tier incentive.

Post-2010/“Modern Home” Pathway

- > Eligibility: Homes built in 2011 and later
 - The 2010 New York Building Code mandated a blower door test for residential buildings for the first time, with performance not to exceed 7 air changes per hour (ACH) when tested at 50 pascals pressure (ACH50)

Past Participation Pathway

- > Eligibility: Homes that participated in a qualifying utility or NYSERDA weatherization program with a **contractor-led** package of measures
 - Con Edison: Weather Ready Program
 - NYSEG/RG&E: Home Insulation and Air Sealing Program (“HIASP”)
 - NYSERDA: Comfort Home Program
 - National Grid: Total Home Comfort
 - Forthcoming Regional Weatherization Programs following Commission action in Case 25-M-0248

- > Further specifics regarding which measures and packages qualify customers for Weatherized Tier incentives will be outlined in the Implementation Plan and Program Manual

Performance Pathway

- > Who uses this: Homes that were built in 2010 and earlier and did not pass through one of the programs eligible in the “Past Participation Pathway”
- > Eligibility: Homes that demonstrate that they are well-weatherized homes by having a building heating load per square foot (BHL/sq ft) below a defined standard. The standard will be different for the Upstate Utilities and Con Edison
 - Con Edison will require third-party verification of a home’s BHL/sq ft. More details will be shared via email and other webinars throughout the summer.
 - The Upstate Utilities will require photo documentation of some Manual J inputs. More details will be shared via email and webinars throughout the summer.

Transitions and Timelines

- > New incentive rates take effect September 1, 2026

- > Grace period for current incentive rates
 - Con Edison
 - Projects that receive preapproval before 8/31
 - Final application by 10/31/26

 - Upstate Utilities
 - Projects installed before 9/1
 - Final Application due no later than 60 days after installation
 - Projects installed after 9/1 will receive the new base rates and Weatherized Tier rates

March 1, 2028 – Weatherization Requirement

- > The May 2025 Non-LMI EE/BE Order mandates that by March 1, 2028, weatherization will be required for projects to be eligible for Clean Heat space heating incentives
- > The Weatherized Tier is a step in the direction of this 2028 requirement
- > The Program Administrators want to hear your feedback as the Program evolves

Geothermal and Project Sizing Topics

Geothermal Topics

> Open Loop Systems

- Open loop systems will be considered for eligibility on a case-by-case basis in upstate service territories starting September 1, 2026. To submit a project for consideration, please inquire with your utility program administrator.

> Buildings with Two Dwelling Units

- Central Hudson, NYSEG, and RG&E have adjusted the incentive rates for buildings with two dwelling units to be equal to the incentives for single-family homes.

> Con Edison New Construction Incentive

- Con Edison will introduce an incentive rate for new construction geothermal projects.

> Bulk Developments/Townhomes

- Bulk developments, i.e., projects that consist of multiple buildings where each unit is equipped with its own independent system, will be eligible to receive the single-family ground source new construction rate for each unit.

Project Sizing

Full-load (10% Electric Resistance Heating)

- The Program will require heat pump systems to be sized for the full load of the home. Electric resistance will be allowed only as a backup outside of normal operations through physical or digital controls.
- Previously, residential projects in Categories 2b, 3, and 4 were allowed to include electric resistance heating not to exceed 10% of BHL.

New “Paused” Contractor Status

Paused Status

- > For the non-Con Edison utilities, a new contractor status of “Paused” was introduced this spring
- > Participating Contractors may be placed in Paused status for accumulating five or more corrective action notices that remain unresolved for more than 30 days
- > Only Corrective Action Reports (CARs) issued on or after March 12, 2026, will count toward a contractor’s total number of outstanding CARs.
- > Paused status warnings began to go out on April 1, 2026.
- > Contractors will have 30 days to resolve outstanding nonconformances before being placed in Paused status

Paused Status

Contractors will be placed in Paused status for a maximum of 60 days before either returning to an active status or being moved to Probation. During Paused status, contractors can expect the following:

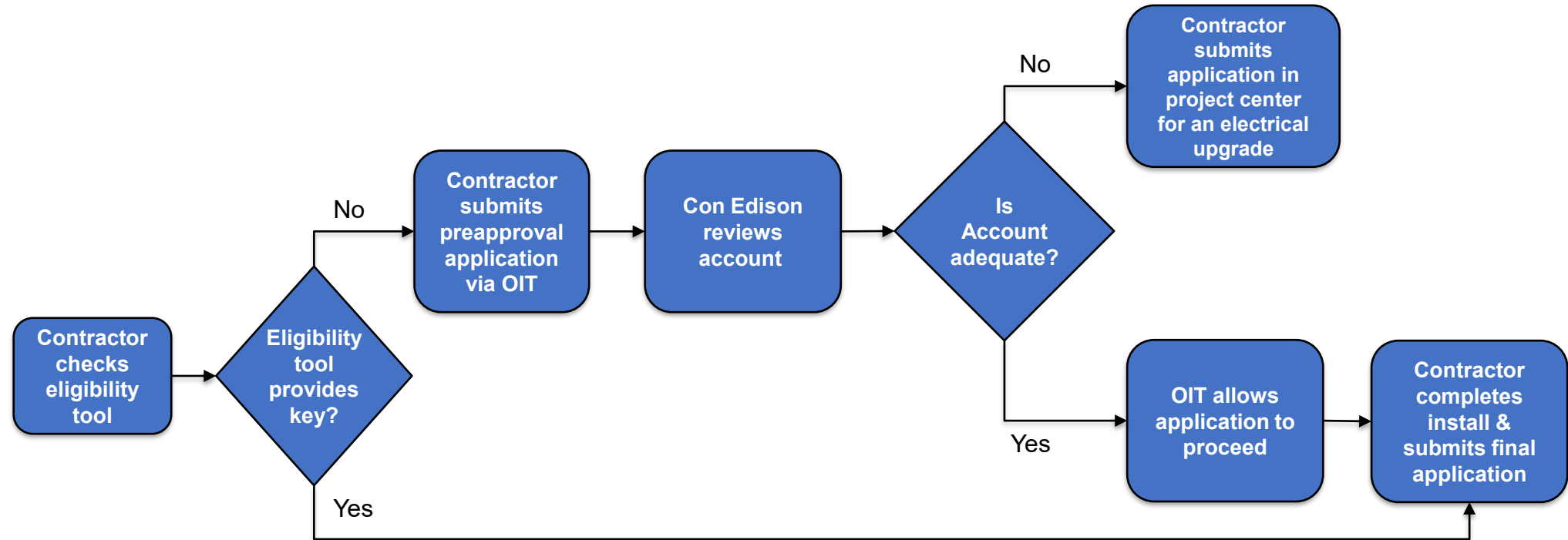
- > May not submit new applications, unless as part of the requested action plan
- > Should not install new Clean Heat projects
- > Will remain in the Find a Contractor tool, but will not have a badged status
- > Will be subject to higher inspection levels as outlined in Quality Policies and Procedures
- > Must remediate all issues related to outstanding corrective action reports

Service Adequacy – Con Edison

Con Edison Service Adequacy Requirements

- > **Con Edison** will implement an additional **service adequacy check**, effective September 1, 2026, when confirming customer eligibility on conedelibility.com.
- > Con Edison will pre-screen customers to determine whether the electrical service to the premises has sufficient capacity to support a heat pump installation before an eligibility key is issued.
- > Some customers will be flagged as requiring additional review.
- > When working with customers who require additional review—or for projects installing heat pump systems larger than 10 tons—Participating Contractors must submit a load letter in Con Edison's Project Center and either (1) obtain an official determination of service adequacy or (2) complete any required service upgrade work **before receiving an eligibility key**.

Update on Con Edison Contractor Allocations

- > Con Edison ASHP Contractors received their Q3 2026 allocations on Tuesday, June 9, 2026.
- > Please reach out to your account manager to request additional funding for projects beyond your allocation as needed.
- > We have designed our process to support flexibility in Q3 around the end of summer and introduction of the Weatherized Tier and will work with you to support additional sales subject to budget availability.
